Meet the Greeks



Geography

Use globes and atlases to find out about Greece.

Use primary and secondary sources of information.

Understand geographical similarities between the UK and Greece;

Observe, measure and record the weather statistics in UK and Greece.

Art

Record and explore ideas from first hand observations and their imagination, using sketches; Know that different grades of pencil produce different lines. Revisit, review and revise their initial ideas adding notations; Plan, design and make Greek pottery; construct and join materials in a variety of ways using tools safely. Use papier mache to create simple 3d effects for masks.

D.

Design a monster that moves using a pneumatic system; Draw annotated sketches in response to a given design criteria; identify the strengths and areas for development of their design; make strong, stiff shell structures and consider which materials to use and evaluate how well the product has been made.

Literacy

Write their own Greek Myth or Legend ensuring that all features of the genre are evident including anguage and structure;
