Christmas Plays

Isn't it amazing how quickly December comes around and what a busy time of year it is. The children are all busy rehearsing their Christmas Plays and they are really looking forward to performing in front of you all.

The Junior Christmas Play takes place on Wednesday 13th December. There will be two performances—one at 2pm and one at 7pm. Tickets are needed for each performance, as numbers are limited. A letter has been sent home to all Junior children with further details.

The KS1 Christmas Play (Year 1 and Year 2) takes place on Tuesday 12th and Wednesday 13th December at 2.30pm. Tickets are not needed for the KS1 play, but we ask that you only attend one performance in order to ensure that everyone has the opportunity to watch.

The Reception children will perform their own Christmas Play on Thursday 21st Dec at 2.45pm. Again tickets are not needed for this performance.

Unlike many schools, we do not charge for tickets, however some of our children will be shaking their buckets in front of you at the end of each performance. You were very generous with your donations last year and as a result we were able to buy our eagerly awaited basketball nets and climbing wall.

This year we would like to replace many of our old, very worn and very tired costumes—some of which have been here nearly as long as Mrs Hymers! We would also like to buy a set of scooters and some outdoor play equipment for the children to use during break times in order to encourage active play.

Christmas Fair

We would like to say a big thank you to all of our families who supported the school at the Christmas Fair last Friday. We raised a fantastic £1, 575 in just over an hour and half. We are going to use the money to buy resources to enhance our new creative, topic based curriculum.


