Year 5 National Curriculum Objectives for Geography: Children will be taught to:

Geographical enquiry and skills.

- Ask searching geographical questions and find out the answers. E.g. Why is that happening there? Could it happen here?
- Analyse evidence and draw conclusions. E.g. Comparing population growth in UK to Brazil.
- Identify and explain different views that people including themselves hold about topical geographical issues. E.g. Should we save the Rainforests? Linked to literacy, balanced arguments.
- Communicate geographical skills and knowledge in ways appropriate to the task including writing at length and numerical and quantitative skills. E.g. A newspaper report, PowerPoint, information booklet, line graphs to show change in weather over time.
- Use appropriate geographical vocabulary relevant to their area of study.
- Use atlases, globes, maps and plans at a range of scales.
- Use primary and secondary sources of information.
- Use ICT to help in geographical investigations. E.g. Creating a data file, graphs and Purple Mash.
