<ul> <li>Florence Nightingale</li> <li>The Great Fire of London</li> <li>George Stephenson and the Rainhill Trials</li> <li>Holidays in the Past</li> <li>Family History</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Understand the differences between things that happened in the past and the present e.g. toys in the past and toys today – holidays in the past and holidays today</li> <li>Describe things that have happened to themselves in the past – sequence pictures and dates of them growing up</li> <li>Order a set of events e.g. sequence The Great Fire of London</li> <li>Use words and phrases such as: now, yesterday, last week, when I was younger, a long time ago, before I was born etc.</li> </ul>
Knowledge and Understanding of Events, People and Changes	Historical Interpretation
<ul> <li>in the Past</li> <li>Recall some facts about people/events before living memory</li> <li>Say why people may have acted the way they did</li> </ul>	• Look at books, videos, photograph, objects and artefacts to find out about the past.
Historical Enguiry	Organisation and Communication
<ul> <li>Recognise that the past is represented in different ways.</li> <li>Look at pictures, TV clips etc. and ask simple questions e.g. which things are old/new? What can we find out from the picture?</li> <li>Look at objects from the past and ask questions – What were they used for? How can we find out?</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Sort events and objects into groups of then and now – e.g. toys</li> <li>Use simple timeline to order events e.g. from the own lifetime</li> <li>Retell stories from the past</li> <li>Role-play – The Fire of London – hot seat Florence Nightingale</li> <li>Talk, write and draw about things from the past</li> </ul>
