



Art Progression of Skills EYFS- Autumn









This is Me!

Learning Opportunities

- Painting a self-portrait- looking at hair and eye colour- using thick and thin brushes (painting)
- Creating self-portraits using natural objects (textiles/collage)
- Drawing black and white pictures of family unit using pencils and felt tips (drawing)
- Mixing primary colours (red, yellow, blue)
- Creating autumnal natural collage artwork(textiles/collage)
- Printing using natural items e.g. leaves, conkers
- Imprints of natural materials in play dough
- Using chalk, pva glue, and glitter, create a piece of artwork to represent bonfire night
- Using red, green and black loose part materials to make a poppy for Remembrance Day (textiles)
- Making a Diya lamp out of salt dough (3D design)
- Making a hedgehog using salt dough and poppy seeds (3D design)
- Engaging in different Christmas craft (baking, card making, making a Christmas tree decoration)
- To draw characters/ simple settings from stories read in Drawing Club

Children participate in provision craft activities related to each week's focus book on a weekly basis.

Skill: To be able to create simple representations of people, objects, and characters based on stories heard.

Progression of Skills

- To develop fine motor skills in order to use a variety of tools confidently and safely
- To explore mark making and using pencils for drawing
- To know how to create closed shapes with continuous lines and begin to use the shapes to represent objects.
- To develop the confidence to draw with increasing complexity and detail
- To competently stick down objects using a glue spreader
- To encourage critical thinking skills when mixing colours and gain knowledge of what other colours can be made through colour mixing
- To understand how the use of a thick or thin brush affects the painting of fine or thick lines
- To manipulate and position the appearance of natural materials, and loose parts
- To gain knowledge of the colours, shapes, and textures of autumnal materials
- To select and use colours for a specific purpose
- To develop the confidence of experimenting with different ways of rolling playdough for effect.
- To develop muscle control by manipulating clay/playdough by rolling, cutting, pinching etc
- To explore and refine a variety of artistic effects to express ideas and feelings

Links to future KS1 Learning

- To experiment with and control marks made with different media e.g. pencils, crayons, felt tips, chalk
- To experiment making different lines with different media e.g. thick, thin, wavy, straight, zig zag
- To accurately draw people's faces
- To draw a self-portrait, using pencil, with features in the correct place
- To use drawing, painting and sculpture to develop and share their ideas, experiences and imagination
- To develop a wide range of art and design techniques in using colour, pattern, texture, line, shape, form and space
- To use a range of materials creatively to design and make products
